Bylaws vote, elections to be held during Mount Airy meet on August 9

The reactivated ALPCA Chesapeake Region held its first meet in August 2010, at which officers were elected from among the membership. In the four years since, we've been operating without bylaws and have not held subsequent elections.

Draft bylaws were submitted to the region's officers in June 2012. The officers determined that the procedures outlined in the proposed bylaws should be followed to consider and potentially approve and ratify the proposed bylaws. The officers voted on and approved the proposed bylaws, as submitted, at their meeting in August 2013.

For these proposed bylaws to become effective, they must be ratified by a vote of the Chesapeake Region membership. That vote will take place at the business meeting during the Mount Airy, Md. meet on August 9, 2014.

Members eligible to vote, as specified in the proposed bylaws, have each been sent a copy of the proposed bylaws and a proxy ballot, which can be used to authorize another member to vote on their behalf if they're unable to attend the August 9 meet. The proposed bylaws are also available for download on the region's web site at www.alpca-chesapeake.org.

Since we have not held elections in four years, we'll also do that on August 9. If bylaws are approved, we will conduct elections in accordance with the bylaws.

The proposed bylaws call for the election of a president and up to four additional directors, who together shall comprise the region's board of directors. The board will elect its own chairman and vice chairman. All other positions, including vice president(s) and treasurer, will be appointed by the board.

Please give serious consideration to stepping up and running for president or director and/or submitting your name for consideration for vice president, treasurer, or some other position. The region cannot function without dedicated volunteers. The duties for each of these positions are described in the proposed bylaws.

To be eligible to run for elected office, you must be an ALPCA member in good standing, have attended at least one of the three most recent Chesapeake Region meets (August 2011, August 2012, and/or August 2013), and not hold an elected office in another ALPCA region.

To be eligible to vote, you must be an ALPCA member in good standing, and either have an address of record within our territory (Va., Md., Del., D.C.) or have attended at least one of the three most recent Chesapeake Region meets.

If bylaws are not approved, we will instead hold elections for the four existing parliamentary offices, or as determined by the voting members in attendance.

Chesapeake Region gathers in Mount Airy, Md. <u>August 9 for more plate collecting fun</u>

Changes made in table allocation in response to last year's sellout



The fifth annual ALPCA Chesapeake Region Summer Plate Meet will be held on Saturday, August 9, 2014 at its usual location in the gymnasium at the rear of St. Michael's Catholic Church of Poplar Springs, 1125 St. Michael's Road, Mount Airy, MD 21771, from 8:00 am until 3:00 pm.

This meet's theme is *License Plates of the Rest of the World*. Awards will be presented for the best non-U.S. plate display, best general display (which in this case means displays that include U.S. plates), and furthest distance traveled. We're defining non-U.S. plates as those issued by jurisdictions outside of the fifty United States and Washington, D.C., so displays of plates from Canada, outlying U.S. territories, and U.S Forces in other countries, for example, are all eligible to compete.

We will hold a business meeting this year to vote on proposed Chesapeake Region bylaws, and to elect regional officers and/or directors. (See article at left for more info on this.)

About fifty 8-foot tables will be available for \$10 each. Admission is \$5 for collectors not renting tables, with free admission for non-collector guests of ALPCA members.

Refreshments and lunch will be available (at no charge this year!), so plan to stay for the whole meet. We'll hold a donation auction once again, of course, with proceeds going toward meet expenses and any amount beyond that going into the region treasury.

Last year we had a record number of collectors in attendance and we ran out of tables. We plan to have a few more tables available this year, but we only have so much room, so there's a chance it could happen again. Therefore, we're making some changes in how tables are allocated this year, so please read this section for important information.

- We strongly encourage reserving the table(s) you need by paying for them in advance (see instructions below).
- Members not reserving and paying for tables in advance will be limited to a maximum of one table and run the risk of not getting a table at all.

2013 Mount Airy meet report

It's apparently no longer a secret that the Chesapeake Region puts on a great plate meet!

On Saturday, August 10, 2013, 68 plate collectors and their 35 guests descended on the gymnasium at St. Michael's Catholic Church in Mount Airy, Md. for the fourth annual ALPCA Chesapeake Region summer plate meet. The old attendance record of 54 collectors was easily shattered. Unfortunately, due to the increased attendance and the church only setting up 40 tables for us rather than the requested 50, a few people who arrived late were unable to get tables.

Despite that, the enthusiasm and energy in the room was evident as plate trading continued unabated throughout the morning. Many collectors brought impressive displays and generously donated quality plates to be auctioned.

The meet's theme was *License Plates of the First State*, and John Willard's 1909-1916 passenger mini-run earned him the best Delaware display award. Ed Burr took home the best general display award with his palindrome plates from all 50 states, and the long distance award went to John Contreras of San Diego, Calif., with an honorable mention going to Steve "16 Lizards" Benson of Mesa, Ariz.

With Kenny O'Dell again serving as auctioneer, the donation auction brought in an impressive \$988.

Anyone who wasn't already full from complimentary doughnuts and bagels certainly was after the pizza lunch. A total of 20 large pizzas were devoured in short order.

After lunch, the plate fun continued for a few more hours, with a few die-hard collectors continuing to trade plates until the clean-up was finished and it was time to lock the doors. ■

Our primary distribution method is now via e-mail, using e-mail addresses shown in the ALPCA membership roster. Newsletters are sent via regular postal mail only to those members who do not have an e-mail address listed in the ALPCA roster, or whose e-mail address is found to be nonfunctional, or who have requested hard copies to be physically mailed to them. - Only those individuals with pre-paid tables or involved with set-up will be admitted to the gym prior to 8:00 am.
- We will institute a lottery system for allocating any unreserved tables at the start of the meet. Lottery registration will take place between 7:30 am and 8:00 am.
- If at 8:00 am there are enough tables for everyone registered, there will be no need to hold the lottery.
 Otherwise, member numbers of those registered will be drawn randomly until all tables are assigned.
- Everyone who has registered by 8:00 am will have an equal chance of obtaining a table, so there's no advantage to arriving significantly early.
- Any tables remaining will be available to members arriving late on a first-come, first-served basis.

To reserve one or more tables... Table reservations will only be accepted when accompanied by payment of \$10 per table. Make checks or money orders payable to *ALPCA Chesapeake Region*, and mail to meet host Rick Kretschmer, at 148 Oak Alley Trail, Clayton NC 27527. Or, pay Rick in person at the ALPCA Convention in July. Please mail table payment early enough to ensure its arrival no later than August 6, 2014.

We will need additional volunteers to help with set-up, control access to the hall, man the registration desk, conduct the lottery, etc. If you can arrive early and are willing to help, please contact meet host Rick Kretschmer. (We can always use volunteers during and after the meet as well.) See the For more information box at bottom right for contact info.

Directions to meet

Mount Airy is between Baltimore and Frederick, along I-70. The church address is 1125 St. Michael's Road, Mount Airy, MD 21771. Get directions from additional places and maps online at www.alpca-chesapeake.org.

From Baltimore: From I-695 (Baltimore Beltway) take exit 16, I-70 west toward Frederick. Take I-70 exit 73, Md. Route 94, and turn left at the end of the ramp onto Md. Route 94 south toward Lisbon. Go 0.4 miles to the traffic circle, and turn right onto Md. Route 144 west. On Route 144, go 1.7 miles, then turn left onto St. Michael's Road. St. Michael's Catholic Church is 0.4 miles on your left. Gym is in the back.

From Frederick, Md.: Get on I-70 east toward Baltimore. Take I-70 exit 68, Md. Route 27, and turn right at the bottom of the ramp onto Md. Route 27 south toward Damascus. Then make an immediate left onto Md. Route 144 east. On Route 144, go 3.9 miles, then turn right onto St. Michael's Road. St. Michael's Catholic Church is 0.4 miles on your left. Gym is in the back.

From Washington, D.C.: From I-495 (Capital Beltway), take either exit 35 or 38 onto I-270 north toward Frederick. At I-270 exit 16, take Md. Route 27 north toward Damascus. Follow Route 27 north roughly five miles beyond Damascus. Just before the I-70 interchange and Mount Airy, turn right onto Md. Route 144 east. On Route 144, go 3.9 miles, then turn right onto St. Michael's Road. St. Michael's Catholic Church is 0.4 miles on your left. Gym is in the back. ■
